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A Rare Milestone of Excellence: Board Results 2026

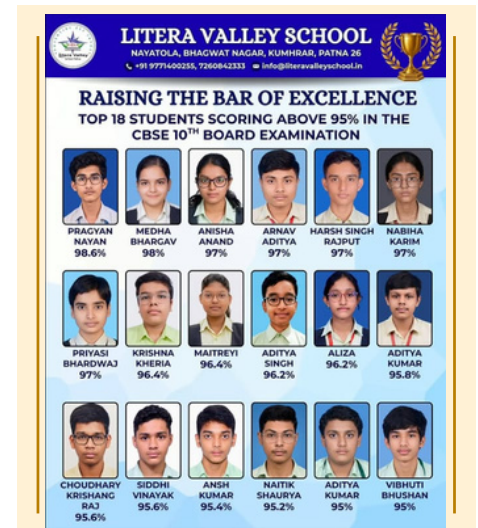
Litera Valley School, Patna, once again redefined academic excellence as CBSE declared the Class 10 results on 15 April 2026. The school’s toppers are not just scholars — they are state-level athletes, artists, and all-rounders who dominated both classrooms and competition arenas.

Leading the merit list is Pragyan Nayan, a State Chess Player, who secured an outstanding 98.6% to emerge as the school topper. Close behind is Medha Bhargav with 98%. A gifted artist, Medha has repeatedly brought laurels to the school through her achievements in art competitions at state and national levels. Securing the third position is Anisha Anand with 97%, who also represents Bihar in Basketball at the state level

“Our toppers are living proof that holistic development brings out the best in a child,” said the School Chairman, Shri Amit Prakash. “When students pursue their interests with discipline, academic success follows naturally. At LVS, we don’t choose between books and the field—we excel in both,” added the Principal, Mr. Desmond Jude D’Monte.

The Headmistress, Mrs. Sujata Bhadani, congratulated the students, parents, and teachers for this year’s excellent board results.

Overall, 81 students scored 90% and above, while 115 students secured between 80% and 89%.
