The Gurgle ...Embarking On Journey

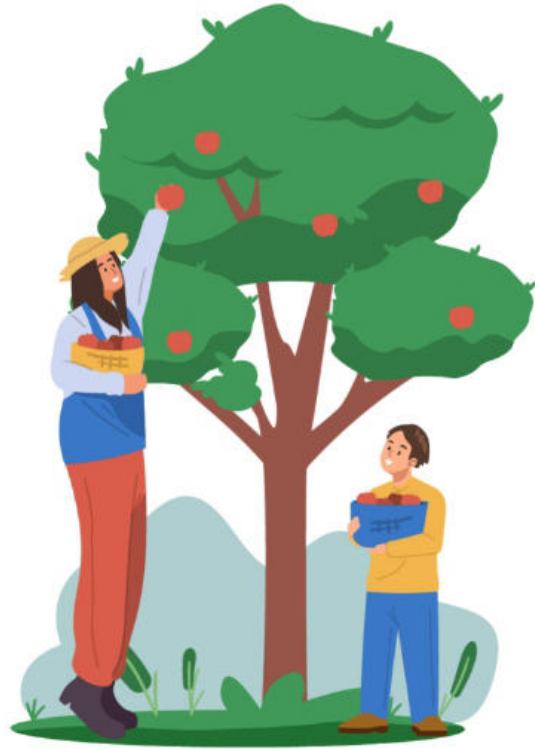
Splish Splash Pitter Patter gifts on a platter,

Dancing Through Divinity: A Journey into the Grace of Odissi

“Dance is the hidden language of the soul.” – Martha Graham

On the 14th of May 2025, the students of Grades 6 to 8 at Litera Valley School witnessed a captivating celebration of India’s classical heritage, brought to life by the SPIC MACAY initiative. The highlight of the event was the presence of **Smt. Kavita Dwibedi**, an internationally renowned Odissi exponent and the daughter of the legendary Guru Harekrishna Behera.

Her presentation was no ordinary performance—it was a masterful blend of storytelling, history, and live art. Through graceful expressions and expressive movement, she took the audience on a journey through the origins and evolution of Odissi, beginning with its sacred roots in the Jagannath Temple of Odisha. She shared how, during the 11th century, political invasions led to a profound shift. As women were no longer allowed to perform within temple sanctums, young boys dressed as females took over the mantle of tradition—a form now known as Gotipua. This adaptation kept the flame of Odissi alive through time.

Dwibedi beautifully expanded the horizon of her performance by discussing the cultural diversity of Indian classical dances—Kathak in the North, Manipuri in the North-East, Kuchipudi in Andhra Pradesh, Bharatanatyam in Tamil Nadu, and Kathakali and Mohiniyattam in Kerala. She explained the core difference between classical and folk dances: in classical art, tradition flows from guru to disciple, while in folk traditions, the community becomes the teacher.

Her explanation of Odissi’s iconic costume elements—the Pushpachuda (floral headgear) and Bengpattaya (silver waistbelt)—added a visual and cultural richness to the experience.

The performance unfolded in evocative segments:

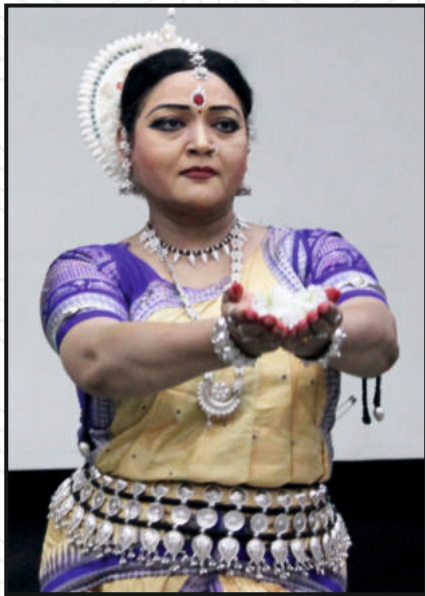
- **Mangalacharan**, an invocatory dance dedicated to Lord Vishnu
- A dramatic depiction of **temple life in Odisha**, featuring elements like torana (gateways), tarpani (ritual offerings), and abhimana (devotional pride)
- A demonstration of the structural postures of Chowka (square stance) and Tribhangi (three bends)
- A closing **Abhinaya** piece—storytelling through mudras and expressions, set in a forest where even nature seemed to dance

Accompanying her were three accomplished musicians whose live performance added spiritual depth to the session—**Manas Sarangi** on Mardal, **Narayan Jena** on Vocal, and **Pradip Maharana** on Violin.

What made the session magical was how it blurred the line between explanation and performance. It wasn’t a lecture—it was a living, dancing conversation between tradition and today. Every movement carried meaning, every expression told a story, and every silence was filled with grace. The event concluded with heartfelt applause and admiration, leaving students inspired and connected to the timeless soul of Indian classical art.

Bihar: The Cultural, Spiritual, and Environmental Heritage

“The greatest threat to our planet is the belief that someone else will save it.”

Have we lost the whispers of our forests, the songs of our rivers, the silent prayers of the Earth? For what length of time will we be neglecting the unseen sufferings of mother nature? If development costs us the soul of the planet, is it still worth it? All these are not mere questions but a reminder of the rapidly rising concern for the environment and human integrity. To get past these worrying questions and have a stable solution for it there is a growing demand for eco-centric development in a world plagued by pollution, deforestation, and climate change. Once abuzz with life, our planet now suffers from human carelessness and greed. The cries of nature are becoming increasingly loud every day, from dying forests to rising temperatures. But there is hope in our traditions—in the trees we treasure, the animals we revere, and the rivers we worship. Bihar, an expanse of extravagant culture and ancient traditions, which held crusades against climate change, is slowly deteriorating its natural, cultural, and spiritual legacy. Age-old sustainable practices like conserving sacred groves, worshipping rivers, and honoring nature through rituals are rashly neglected in the rush of modernization. Rivers like the Ganga and Punpun are choking with waste, and heritage forests like Valmiki Tiger Reserve are under constant threat. The cultural bond with nature that once defined Bihar now weakens with every passing day.

To get a hold of these worrying problems the Bihar Government has taken several steps over the years which have turned out to be immensely helpful along with other unexplored ways. Clearly, the foremost problem is of maintaining the biodiversity which is very essential for ecosystems, providing clean air, water, and food. But today Bihar faces biodiversity loss due to agricultural expansion, illegal hunting, and rapid urbanization. Solutions to these include strengthening protected areas like the Valmiki Tiger Reserve and developing eco-parks. The Earth Heroes Award given by Valmiki Reserve honours efficient conservation, resilient surveillance, and eco-tourism that maintains endangered species.

The next adversity is on Bihar's flood prone rural areas which are severely affected due to the climate shift. To get a hold on this issue, post-2017 floods, Bihar launched the Jal-Jeevan-Hariyali campaign. It focused on restoring water bodies, planting millions of trees, and promoting rainwater harvesting to strengthen ecological balance. This step not only gives a stable solution but also builds a foundation for the rural communities to thrive and inspire the philosophy of climate justice.

Urbanization in Bihar has led to rapid increase in waste generation from houses, factories, corporate firms etc. To solve this problem the promotion of zero-waste initiatives should be encouraged such as recycling and composting the waste. The Patna Municipal Corporation took a major step by starting door to door waste collection through garbage vans and banned plastic bags below 50 microns as well. To make this initiative successful, an active participation from the residents is highly needed which in turn will make the state cleaner and greener.

The next thing that is to be discussed is not just a problem but deterioration of cultural beliefs and age-old traditions that are meant for preservation. Reverence for nature is fading away into utter negligence and consumerism. To overcome this problem the old traditions should be rekindled and eco-conscious methods should be used to celebrate festivals. Chatth Puja in Bihar reflects deep respect for nature by offering prayers to the Sun God. Recently many campaigns have encouraged the use of organic ways to perform the rituals and have also taken the initiative to clean the ghats post-festival. This shows how ancient traditions can be adapted to support modern environmental needs.

After presenting a few yet core problems of the state of Bihar the most subtle solution for its citizens is to adhere to eco-centric development and eco-conscious methods to interact with the nature to keep everything in balance. Along with the initiatives taken by the government the citizens are the key to a greener and cleaner state. For it is not only laws or plans that bring back the world, but the quiet decisions made by many hands and hearts daily. Real growth is measured not by lofty buildings or busy highways, but by the serenity of our rivers, the lushness of our land, and the melody of the breezes through the woods. When citizens work in sync with nature, they not solely establish a better state, but also continue the legacy of peace, faith, and life itself.

ORIENTATION 2025-26: Charting the Path Ahead

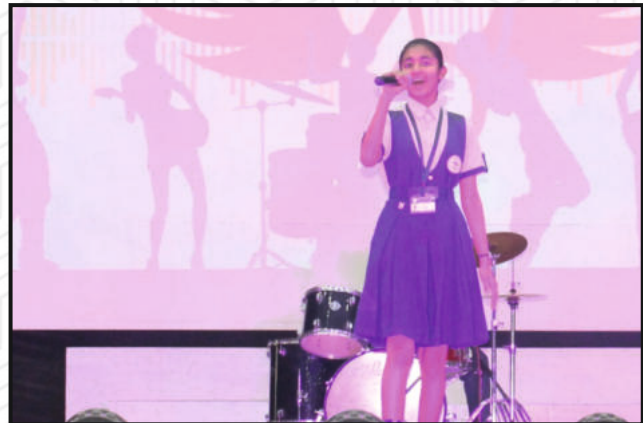

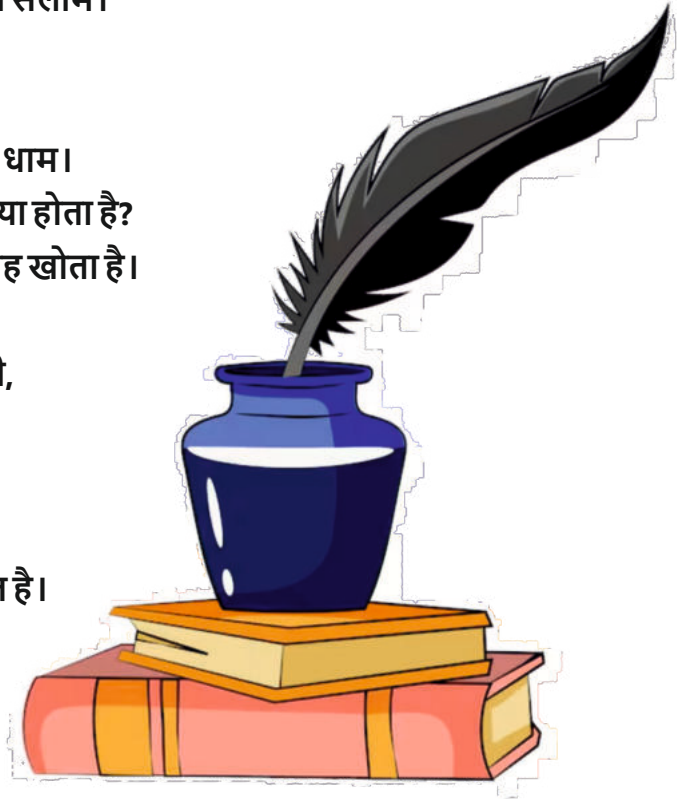

But how you think — to prove you're wise.

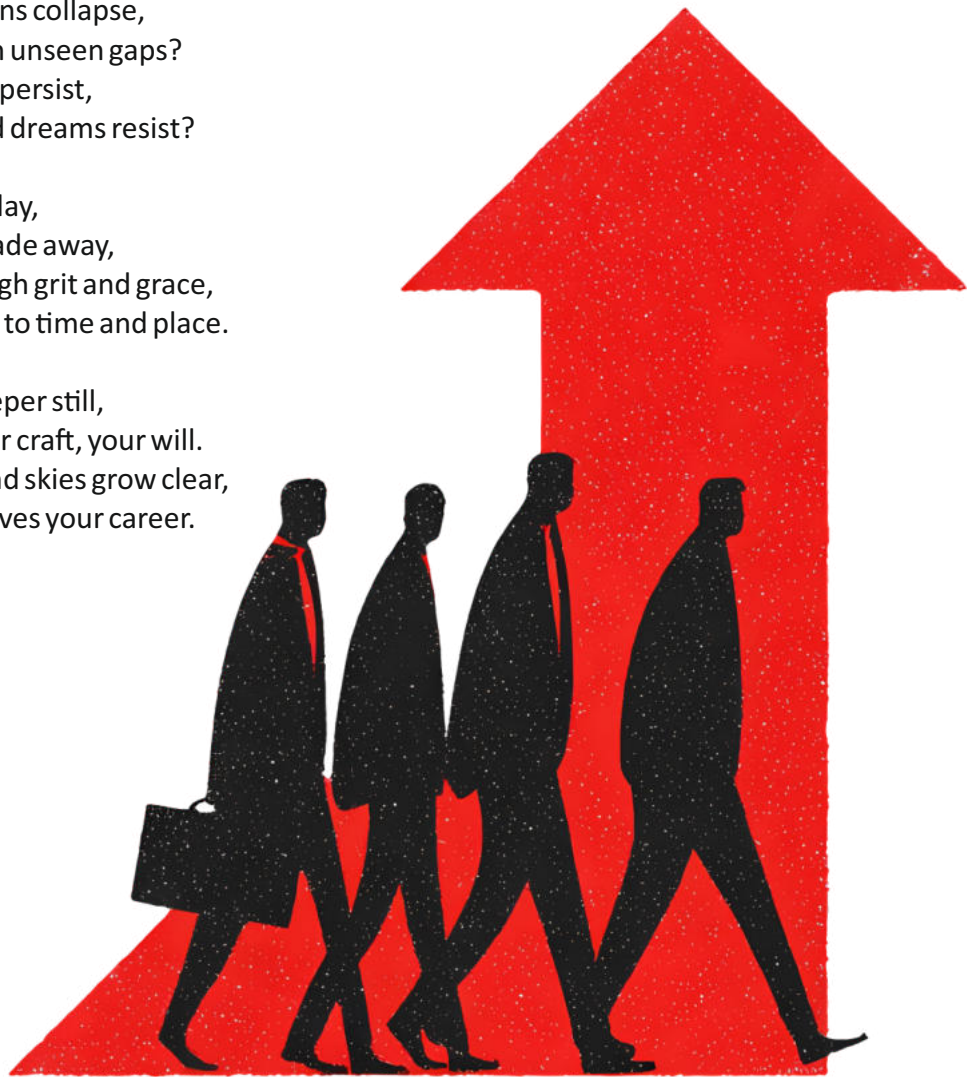
The hands that build, the minds that lead,

Even the exams and homework, though sometimes tough, teach us discipline and patience. They prepare us to face challenges in life with courage and determination.

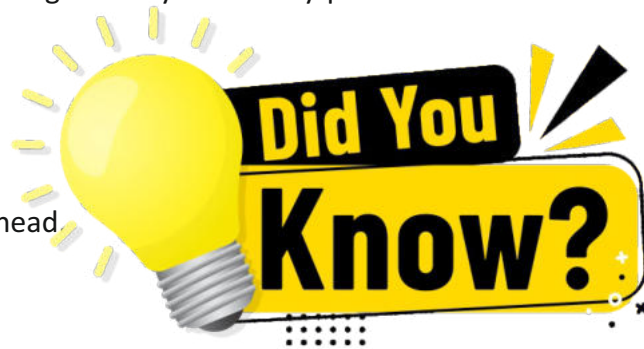

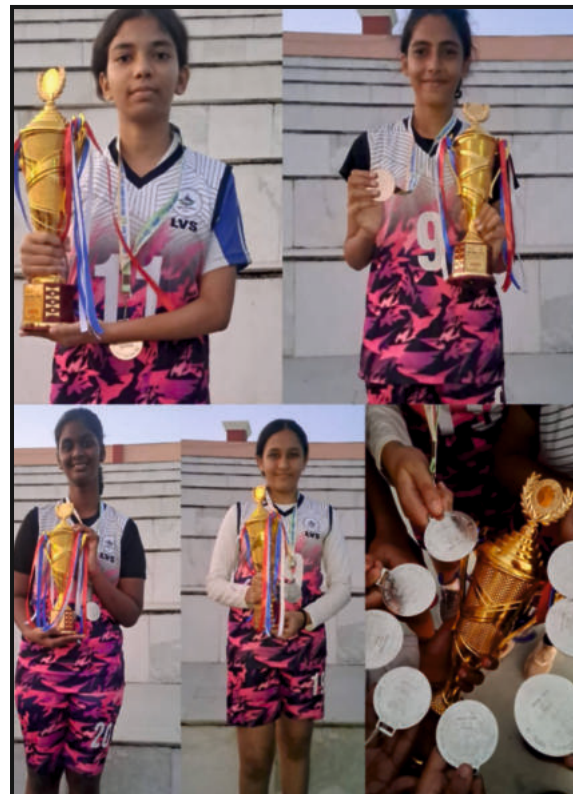

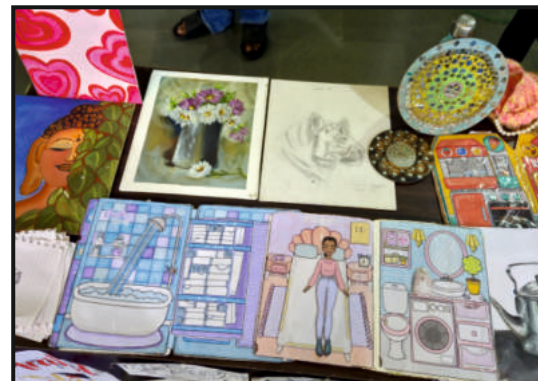
Young Minds At Work – Innovation Day

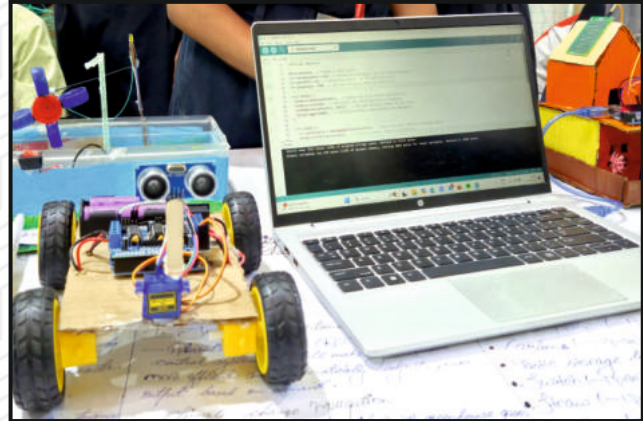
